

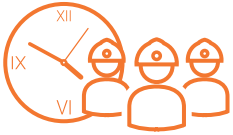

Oyu Tolgoi continued upskilling its employees in accordance with its vision and provided 318,927 people/hours of training to its employees by the end of the third quarter of 2020.

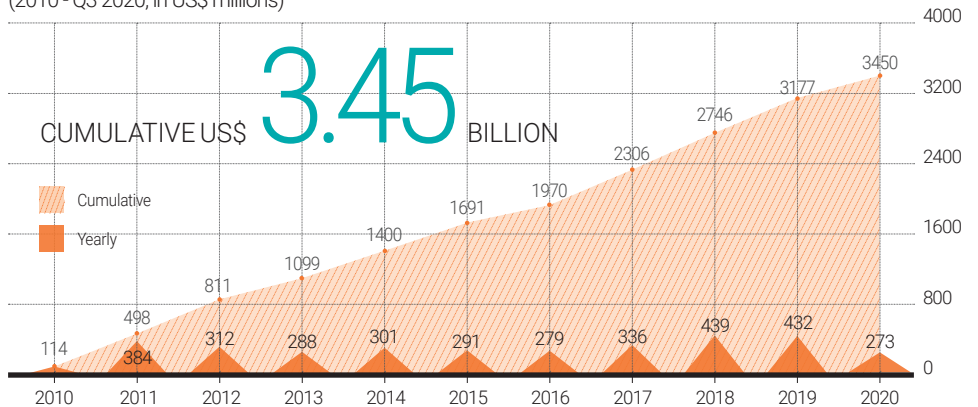

NATIONAL PROCUREMENT

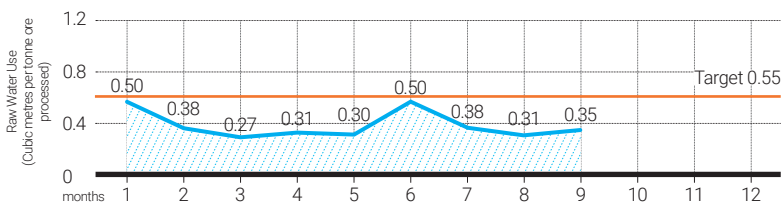
(2010 - Q3 2020, in US\$ millions)



Oyu Tolgoi operation's procurement team collaborated with 703 suppliers at the end of the third quarter of 2020, of which 468 are national businesses that account for 73 per cent of total operations procurement spend. Between 2010 and the third quarter of 2020, Oyu Tolgoi spent US\$3.45 billion on national procurement.

(Cubic metres per tonne of ore processed by months)



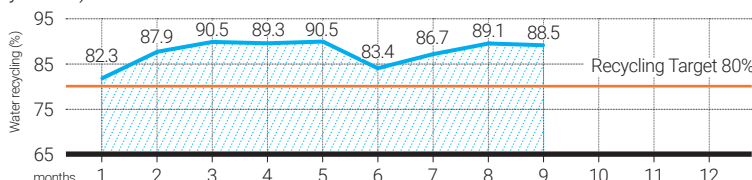
WATER USAGE PAYMENT

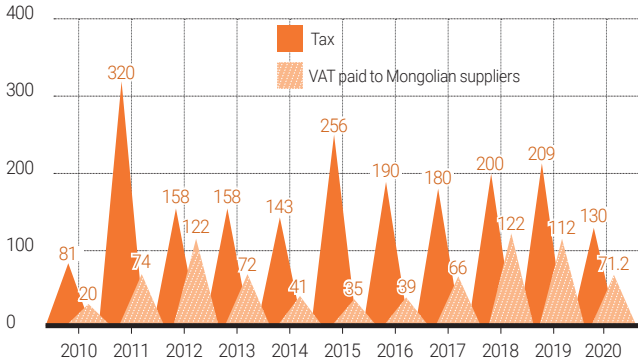


At the end of the third quarter of 2020, we exceeded our water recycling target of 80 per cent, reaching 87.5 per cent.

was paid in taxes, fees and other payments.

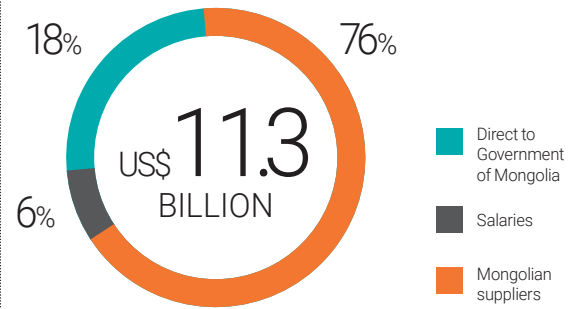

TOTAL IN-COUNTRY SPEND

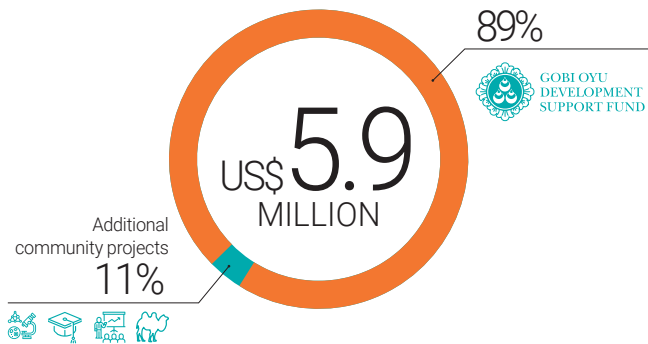

SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS IN THE UMNUGOVI PROVINCE

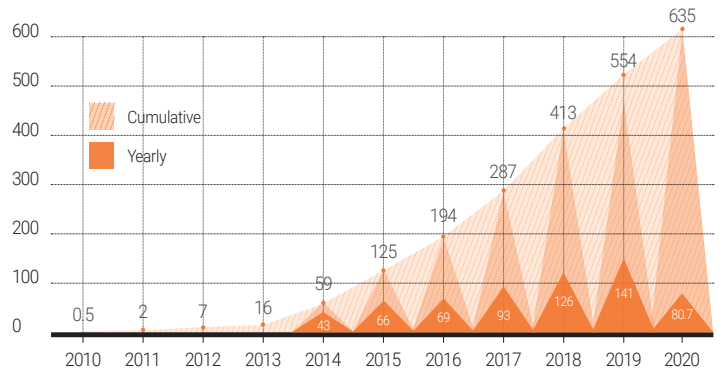

LOCAL PROCUREMENT (UMNUGOVI PROVINCE)

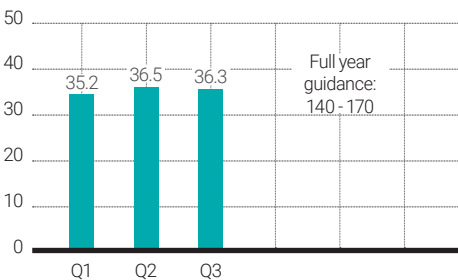
(2010 - Q3 2020, in US\$ millions)

PRODUCTION OF COPPER IN CONCENTRATE

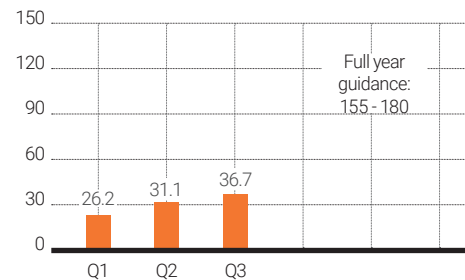
('000 tonnes)

PRODUCTION OF GOLD IN CONCENTRATE

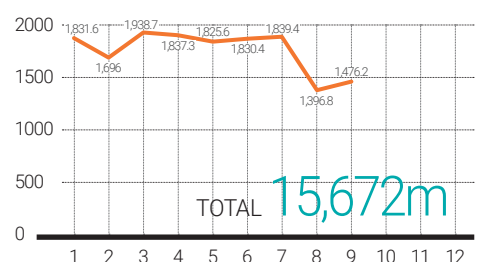
('000 ounces)
